

**FIRE CONTROL BYLAW**

---

A Bylaw of the Resort Village of Mistusinne to set minimum standards for the control of fire pits, chimineas, wood stoves, fireplaces, and other outdoor approved appliances in the Resort Village.

The council of the Resort Village of Mistusinne in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

PART I – INTRODUCTION

1. Title  
This Bylaw shall be known and may be cited as the Fire Control Bylaw.
2. Purpose  
The purpose of this bylaw is to regulate and control the use of appliances and devices which burn wood and other material within the limits of the Resort Village.

PART II – DEFINITIONS

3. Whenever in this Bylaw, the following words or terms are used, they shall, unless the text otherwise provides, be held to have the following meanings:
  - (a) "Owner" – shall mean the person, persons or corporate entity designated as the registered owner of a property on the tax roll of the Resort Village of Mistusinne.
  - (b) "Resort Village" – shall mean the Resort Village of Mistusinne

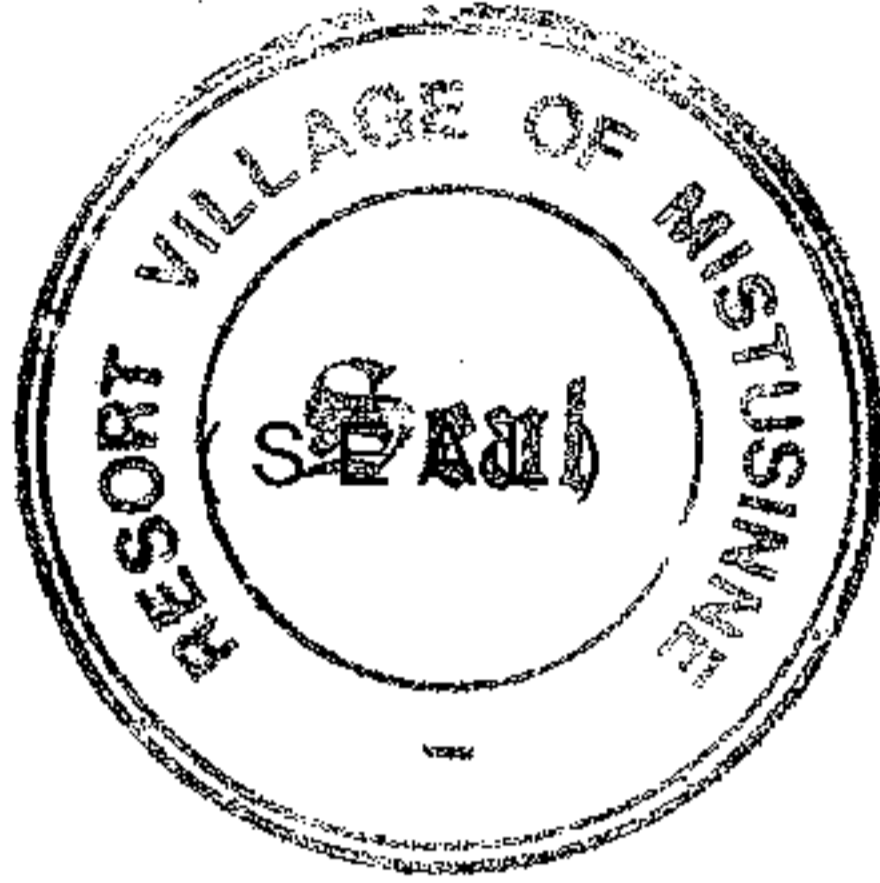
PART III - REGULATIONS


4. No material or fuel other than seasoned wood, manufactured fire logs, propane, or other town approved material or fuel may be burned in a fire pit, indoor wood burner, chiminea or portable fireplace.
5. The burning of the following material is prohibited:
  - Rubbish
  - Garden refuse or leaves
  - Manure
  - Livestock or animal carcasses
  - Any material classified as a dangerous good; and any material which when burned will generate black smoke or an offensive odor including asphalt roofing materials, hydrocarbons, plastics, rubber materials, creosote wood or any similar material.
6. Fire pits must be lined or surrounded by brick, stone, metal rim, or similar material.
7. Open air fires shall be reasonably supervised so as to prevent their spread and the flames of such shall not exceed one (1) metre in height.
8. The fire must be attended to at all times with a water source available.

9. The Council of the Resort Village of Mistusinne reserves the right by resolution to temporarily ban the use of any fire pits, portable fireplaces or chimineas should conditions warrant it.

PART IV – ENFORCEMENT


10. Any person found guilty of an infraction of this Bylaw or any part thereof, shall be liable to a \$200 penalty, or *The Fire Prevention Act* 1992.
