## Council Meeting Highlights

April 19, 2026, meeting.

Council approved the minutes of our March 22, 2026, regular meeting of council. These are available on our website. The next regular meeting will be held on Friday, May 15 at 7:00 p.m. at the Municipal Office. Mistusinne Morning will be the next morning, May 16 from 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. Our June meeting will be held on Friday, June 19 at 7:00 p.m. Please be advised that the office will be closed May 22.

There were no delegates to the meeting.

Edward Stenko presented his verbal report. The Community Centre has new flooring! The floor looks amazing. Thank you Edward. Equipment Maintenance is complete, and our equipment is ready for season opening, no big surprises were found. Our Parks employee returns to work for the season on Tuesday. Golf season is right around the corner. Hopefully! A new postal auger will be purchased in preparation for this year's projects. 320 new trees will be added to the nursery next week. The hedges in need of maintenance throughout the Village will be cut down for regrowth before the heat arrives.

TREE PLANTING DAY is Sunday, May 31. We need your help. If you are available, please let us know. There will be a BBQ lunch at 1:00 p.m. It would be great to have a rough number of how many will be in attendance. Kelly is looking for a couple of volunteers who would be willing to help with the BBQ. Please let her know if you are interested. During the annual survey we asked residents to point out trees that need to be assessed for removal. Council and staff are working their way through the list. Please be advised that we cannot remove trees on private property. We can, however, provide a replacement tree from the nursery if residents wish to complete their own projects. Council will be undertaking tree removal via contracted services for the trees needing additional removal assistance on municipal property. Council is inviting contractors to submit a bid by 2:00 p.m., Thursday, May 7, 2026. Please contact Foreman Edward Stenko if you are interested in more information. Council will be installing above ground driplines to assist with the tree watering. We are currently working on a planting and watering plan. There will be significant planting on the Golf Course. Councilor Coutts has committed endless hours to this project. Thank you Councilor Coutts.

Council has passed Bylaw No. 04-2026; Storage Yard Usage Bylaw. A copy will be available on the Bylaw page of our website. This bylaw will help keep the criteria regarding use of the storage yard clear. Please be aware that occupants of storage yard spots are responsible for keeping their spot neat and tidy, and the grass cut.

Administration will be making a request to be allowed to present Bylaw Enforcement Infractions to the Circuit Court in Outlook, SK. This would allow infractions pertaining to the Off – Road Vehicle Bylaw, the Noise Bylaw, and the Animal Control Bylaw to be addressed at the highest level. Please be sure to review all three bylaws available online to ensure you are complying. No one enjoys Bylaw enforcement; however, all residents have the right to enjoy their time at the lake, please do your part so enforcement is not necessary.

Council was required to rediscuss repairs to the Boat Launch at this meeting. 7 - 4'X10' concrete slabs were quoted incorrectly by Precon in Saskatoon. We are now checking with other suppliers and will purchase the best option, to have the Boat Launch and Dock operational when the season opens. With the project now coming in higher than originally estimated, administration is on the hunt for grant funding. TSS Enterprise's from Outlook will remove the broken pads and replace them with the new ones. We hope to have this project completed mid-May.

We have two sponsorship opportunities under way. The Community Complex currently has a gravel floor, and council would like to add a concrete floor to further expand our entertainment options. We require a \$15,000 sponsorship for this project. Council also plans to undertake a retaining wall on the beach to preserve the integrity of the shoreline. The wall will be 300 feet long and 3 feet high and made of Concrete Blocks We are offering blocks within the wall for \$500.00 each. We have 150 blocks available. Each block is 4 ft long, 3 ft wide, and 2 ft tall. With spring among us please check your yard for any unsightly concerns. Please tidy up anything needing addressing. Reminder letters will be sent out in early May. The Nuisance Bylaw is available on the Bylaw page of our website if you need a refresher.

Development in Mistusinne requires a development permit if it is larger than 10X10. If you are not sure please ask.

Tax Notices and Fee Invoices for 2026 have been distributed via email. If you did not receive yours, please email [office@mistusinne.com](mailto:office@mistusinne.com) to have a copy forwarded. Please be sure to check your SPAM folders and add us to the safe sender list if necessary. All taxes paid prior to May 31 will receive a 15% discount on the municipal portion. Golf Passes will be purchased online this year. There is no physical pass to pick up. Do I have anyone interested in purchasing their pass now that would test the online module? Boat Launch permits are changing this year as well. No more picking up a new pass every year. New and improved passes will be available at Mistusinne Morning and are good from year to year.
